
About NAC-SOYF, INC

The NAC-Save Our Youth Foundation, Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) public charity as designated by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in December 2005. It is the philanthropic arm of the historic Norfolk (VA) Alumni Chapter which was established October 4, 1940.

Scholarship and mentoring services was started in the Chapter in 1941 by founding members of the Chapter. The late James A. Overton was appointed the chapter's first Guide Right Program Director. He would later become a Civil Right Attorney and Judge, and received Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. second highest achievement Award, the elder Watson digs Award. From the very beginning the Norfolk (VA) Alumni chapter was committed to assisting youth through scholarships and mentoring services.

Operating for seven years, the NAC Save Our Youth Foundation, Inc. is the premier youth Foundation sponsored by a historic fraternity, providing scholarships and mentoring services to South Hampton Roads youth. The 501 (c) (3) provides scholarships to Hampton Roads minority youth and supports mentoring services in five Norfolk Public Schools.

Since it was established in 2005, the Foundation has provided more than \$52,000.00 in scholarships, and grants to youth and adults in Hampton Roads. With a low administrative cost, ninety-five percent (\$95) of every dollar contributed to or earned front sponsored events is used to help a youth pursue his or her goals.



Summary of Accomplishments in 2012

The NAC-Save Our Youth Foundation, Inc. completed the 2011 calendar year very successfully. Keeping its promise to use resources efficiently and effectively, the Foundation has provided scholarships to qualified and deserving high school graduates, supporting mentoring and tutoring at-risk elementary and secondary high school youth and other charitable causes.

The Foundation vision is to improve the educational, social, and economic prospect of low-income at-risk youth and adults in Southampton Roads.

The Foundation sources of funds include receipts from its Annual Black History Month community Service Awards Program, Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Classic, membership dues, individual and corporate donations and sponsorships

In 2012, the Foundation is continuing on the path of low administrative cost and maximizing it contributions and grants to worthy youth to assist them in reaching their career and life goals. Scholarships and grants awarded in 201 include the following:

The Annual Black History Month Community Service Awards Program

The 14th Annual 2012 Black History Month Community Service and Honors Program were held in the Murray Center, Norfolk, Virginia. Over 300 guests including corporate executives, Kappa's, families, and youth participated in the event. Dr. Charles H. Harris, II, Superintendent, Sussex County Public Schools, was the keynote for the event, and he emphasized the contributions of the HBCUs for over 100 years to the nation and world. Dr. Harris is a native of Mecklenburg County, Virginia. He obtained his Bachelor's Degree from Virginia State College (University) in 1977, masters in Education from the University of Virginia in 1981, and his Doctors Degree in Education Administration from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in 1998. Dr. Harris career in

education extends over 35 years as a Social Studies Teacher/Coach in Montross, Virginia; Assistant Principal in Palmyra, Virginia; Principal in Goochland and Spotsylvania Counties; and director of Middle Schools in Spotsylvania County Public Schools. Dr. Harris has been serving as the Division Superintendent for Sussex County Public Schools since 1998.

Dr. Harris emphasized the importance of supporting the HBUCs and chronicled the success on these institutions to society's progress. He also noted the importance of collaboration and partnerships between universities and high schools. He described the Virginia State's Academic Partnership (VSAPP), entered an agreement with Virginia State University to establish a dual enrollment program for Sussex County's secondary students. According to Dr. Harris, quoting Dr. Keith T. Miller, President, Virginia State University, said that the dual enrollment partnership epitomizes "win-win" collaboration between secondary schools and higher education. Dr. Harris philosophically believes that all students can learn, and high expectations must be set for every child.

The 2011 Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Classic

The Foundation held its 15th Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Classic at Cahoon Plantation Golf Course, Chesapeake, Virginia. The golf classic is one of the Foundation's major fund raisers and provides opportunities for individuals, corporations, nonprofit and community organizations to participate as sponsors, and players. Their support makes it possible for the Foundation to fund scholarships and to support mentoring initiatives.

This year's Foundation's Swinging for Our Youth Golf Classic featured the 4 Man best Ball (Captain's Choice) format, Shotgun Start, and an Awards Luncheon. Golfers from Maryland, North Carolina, Virginia, and Texas participated for the first prize of \$1,000.00. The team from Bayside Harley Davidson, Family Enterprise, Inc. placed first in the tournament. Bayside Harley Davidson also sponsored two hole-in-one prizes consisting of 2012 Harley-Davidson Sportster 883L, \$1000.00 Shopping Spree for Cutter & Buck, Taylor Made Driver and Fairway Woods, and Vacation for Four (4) to Silver Legacy Resort Casino.
